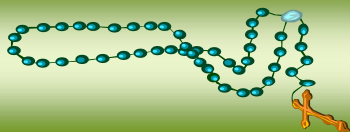

And they just keep coming and coming...

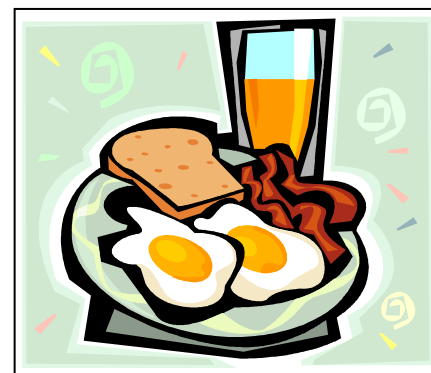

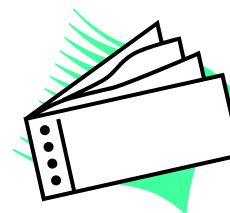

Dinner dance celebrates marriage, aims to strengthen couples

"I, Richard, take you, Millie, again to be my wife." The two held hands and stared lovingly into each other's eyes as they renewed their wedding vows.

Richard Biestek, 86, and his wife Millie, 88, have been married for 64 years.

"Sixty-four years," Millie said proudly, then with a twinkle in her eye "Sixty-four years to the same man!"

The two met downtown when Millie was a teller and Richard worked in service at the First National Bank of Chicago. When some of the ladies were giving names to the guys in the back, Millie pointed out Richard and said they could give her number to him. The couple didn't start dating until more than a year later, however, when they were reunited on an Addison Street bus. They eventually got married and had four children.

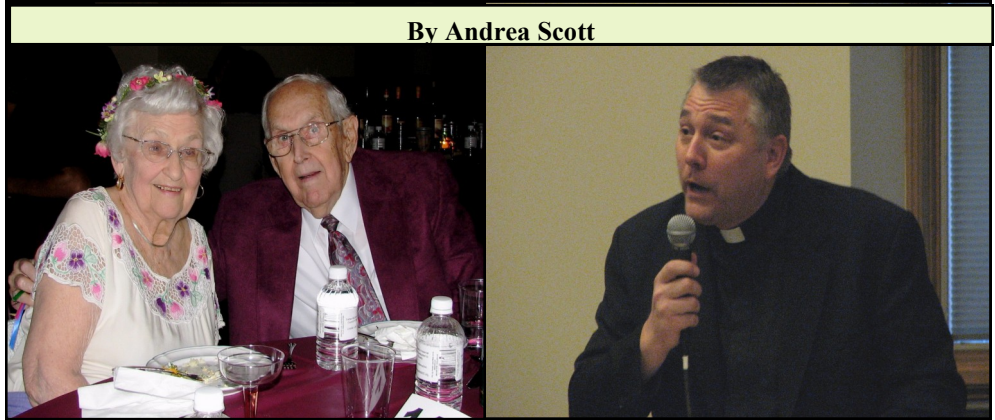
Now, six decades later, the Biesteks joined more than 90 other couples in renewing their wedding vows at A Celebration of Marriage Dinner Dance held at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish in Crystal Lake. Held on Sept. 24 at 6 p.m. in the parish's community center, the event was an opportunity to bring married couples of the parish together to renew their vows and for a night of food, dancing and community.

Parishioner Jeff Ladd was the emcee for the evening, and Jeff James of Y 103.9 WWYW-FM rolled the tunes on his classic vinyl records.

The Rev. Jerome Koutnik shared some thoughts on marriage before the vow renewal ceremony.

"Strive at all costs to increase the bonds of love," he said. "You should be praying for a good marriage every day. There are no perfect marriages, but make your marriage the best."

There was everything from a guestbook, to party favors, a champagne toast and a traditional wedding cake served for dessert. Disposable cameras were on every table for cou-

ples to take candid shots. The photos will be shown at a follow-up event in the near future.

The evening was a joint effort between the St. Thomas Marriage Committee and the Knights of Columbus Fr. McCormick Council 3880.

The Knights of Columbus were in charge of cooking, cleaning and bartending. Some of their wives, the members of the Ladies Auxiliary, were in charge of serving the meal.

Steve Starr, the Knight in charge of the evening, said the Knights of Columbus initially put forth the funds for the evening. This was not a fundraising event for our council, Starr said, but an opportunity to gather the couples of the parish together and enjoy an evening out.

The Marriage Committee was started as part of the Rockford Diocese's Marriage-Building Initiative for 2011. The Marriage Committee's goal is to reach out to all married couples in the parish.

"We need to do all we can to strengthen and support our marriages," said Dawn Ahsmann, a leader on the committee.

The committee sponsored a six-week couples prayer series last spring, which was very well attended, said Ahsmann. The dinner dance was the Marriage Committee's biggest event so far, she said, but they have an upcoming speaker and will continue to provide opportunities for married couples, whether they have been married 65-years or less than a month.

Kendra and Colin Picchiatti met and became best friends in the eighth-grade. Eight years

later, during their senior year of college, they started dating. The couple was recently married at St. Thomas on Aug. 27.

Though tempted to move closer to their jobs, they decided to stay in Crystal Lake to be near their church.

"We want to base our first year of marriage on faith and events like this," Colin said.

The St. Thomas community is important to the newlyweds. They said their parish gives them opportunities that will help build themselves, and their marriage, up.

"I don't know how people do it when they don't have community like this," Kendra said. "It's such a huge support. It constantly brings you back to the things that are important."

The Picchiatti's also mentioned that many of the married couples in the parish are setting great examples for them to learn from and follow.

Couples like Richard and Millie Biestek give the newlyweds hope for their marriage. The Biestek's are happy to be those examples.

As for Millie's advice for a long, healthy marriage?

"Always agree with your husband," she said with a laugh as she grabbed onto Richard's arm.

It's easy to see that the last line of their renewed vows is true: "And if I had to do it all over again I would, because I love you."
