

Next weekend, we welcome Fr. Peter Schavitz, a Redemptorist Priest, to present our Parish Mission. Hopefully, you are looking forward to being present for our Parish Mission and sharing the news with others. I know Fr. Schavitz is looking forward to spending some time with our Faith Community.

“My Lord and My God! Trust in Christ When the Road is Unclear.” This is the theme for our Parish Mission. It reflects the great proclamation of faith made by our Patron, Saint Thomas the Apostle, as well as acknowledging that there are times when all of us have moments of doubt and pain. All of us have times when the road before us is unclear. Our patron was at his weakest when he was away from his community. He made his great statement of faith when he was surrounded by the love and support of his fellow Apostles. I pray that our Parish Mission is a time when we can all come together united by a spirit of love and mercy.

I wrote the following prayer to help guide us into the upcoming Parish Mission experience:

CHANCELLOR'S THOUGHTS

Watch the Deacon.

When I was a kid going to mass with my parents, brothers, and sisters every weekend, we all seemed to do it. During the Our Father we'd hold hands, slightly elevated, and then with the doxology, "For thine is the kingdom, ..." we'd raise our hands higher. I don't remember if this was something we had done from the beginning (at least from my beginning) or did it creep in at some point. Many others did it too, and if they weren't holding someone's hand, they'd have their hands raised, usually palms-up, like the priest. Many did this, and many still do, but not the deacon.

Over the years I've learned that this raising of the hands with palms facing up is called the Orans Position and is something only the priest should be doing. The priest's hands are different from anyone else's in the congregation, including the deacon's, since the priest's hands are anointed and there are certain gestures reserved for the priest. In fact, in August of 1997 the Holy See published an Interdicasterial Instruction document titled, "Ecclesiae de Mysterio: On certain questions regarding the collaboration of the non-ordained faithful in the Sacred ministry of the priest by eight dicasteries of the Holy See" in which is the following statement:

"To promote the proper identity (of various roles) in this area, those abuses which are contrary to the provisions of canon 907 are to be eradicated. In eucharistic celebrations deacons and non-ordained members of the faithful may not pronounce prayers — e.g. especially the eucharistic prayer, with its concluding doxology — or any other parts of the liturgy reserved to the celebrant priest. Neither may deacons or non-ordained members of the faithful use gestures or actions which are proper to the same priest celebrant." (Article 6, paragraph 2)

If deacons shouldn't be doing this then neither should we, that is, holding our hands up during the Our Father and raising them further at the doxology. Should we still hold hands? Nothing in the document mentioned above says we can't, but I've heard apologists talk about how we shouldn't add gestures to the Mass that aren't formally there. It's your call. As a family, we continue to hold hands, but we leave them at our sides. Whatever you choose to do, watch the deacon, and if he isn't doing it then maybe think twice.

FEBRUARY BREAKFAST



Well, the sun was shining when we opened the doors for the February Breakfast... and maybe that sunshine pushed people out into it... the crowd was very light for the first two masses, and although the after 10:30 mass came in pretty heavy, we still fell short of about 50 people to make my goal of 200 diners... but those that came had a great breakfast and left with smiles on their faces!

Even some of the usual workers were absent, but the crew took care of business. People often comment on what months are generally slower... February is one of them, but over the last 5 or 6 years May and June have also had lower numbers more often than not. However, overall, the Breakfast is still holding it's own as a major event. Food prices are one of the wildest fluctuating commodities, as anyone who does grocery shopping regularly can tell you. They certainly contribute to the ups and downs of the profit picture. I've commented in the past about egg prices, varying up to over \$50.00 for a case of 15 dozen, to this week price of just over \$21.00 for the same case. While the goal is to not lose money, we also try to keep the prices the same for as long as possible. The goal for the Breakfast has always been, and always will be, to bring the Parish community together for a friendship gathering... sit with friends and have a great breakfast at an affordable price. The Steak & Egg breakfast is one particular menu item that I need to be very careful with, as evidenced by the price hike several months ago due to the skyrocketing cost of beef. Bacon is another costly item yet that has come down this last month, but the cost of the Corned Beef Hash rose dramatically! It really is a vicious circle! So we try our best to make it good for everyone... we still sell a nice number of Steak & Egg plates, and the little kids love the chocolate chip mini pancakes.. while a number of the dad's go for the bigger Meat Lovers specials... Something for everyone and lots of variety... that's the goal and hope it works for all of you!

Brothers are encouraged to exercise their right to vote in the upcoming Illinois Primary Election on Tuesday, March 17th. These are Democrat and Republican party primary elections and non-partisan referendum votes.

Beginning March 2nd, you can take advantage of Early Voting at 13 different locations in McHenry County, including the Crystal Lake Library, Nunda Township and Algonquin Township or Lake in the Hills Village Hall.

March 2026

So, Thomas, called Didymus, said to his fellow disciples, “Let us also go to die with him.” (Gospel for March 22, Jn 11:16)

Look at the bravery of Thomas! Jesus had just announced his intention to travel to Judea, where he had narrowly escaped getting stoned to death. Given the potential danger ahead, Thomas seems prepared for martyrdom. Later, of course, he and the other disciples would flee as Jesus was arrested, and Thomas would doubt reports of Jesus' resurrection. As fallible humans, our strength and resolve sometimes collapse into weakness. May we always seek the courage to follow Jesus faithfully, even when the going gets tough.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, as we continue through Lent, I challenge you to pray the Stations of the Cross each week — in your parish community, with your family or individually — with the intention of receiving the courage to suffer for Christ. FROM THE DESK OF THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY



Worthy Brothers... As you are reading this message, it is very late February or early February. Our Council operates on a Fiscal Calendar of July 1st through June 30th with Supreme. However, we also operate on the calendar for our dues. In December I printed and mailed out the dues Invoices for the 2026 calendar year. These are then due by February 1st. To date, 96 of the 203 paying members are fully paid, or Members in Good Standing. You see, In Good Standing includes being current on your dues. Unfortunately, we also have almost 40 members who have not paid any dues in the past 2 and even 3 years! This is a hardship for the Council as we also pay an assessment to Supreme, the State Council and even the Rockford Chapter each year based on the number of members on the official roster. The amount varies but comes to around \$10.00 each combined. So easily \$400.00 per year we pay for those who don't want to. That wording may be a bit harsh... but it isn't. EVERY time I send out an initial Invoice AND the Second Invoice or even a THIRD Invoice it ALWAYS contains the clause that "...if these dues are a financial hardship on you currently,

PLEASE contact me directly, since as the Financial Secretary I have the authority to waive your dues and only YOU AND I will be aware of it!!! NO ONE will know your name"! Yet over the past 4 years only 1 person has done this. All the others simply ignore their obligation to the Council. Again, harsh words, but they can't pick up a phone and talk to me... in this day and age, money is very tight and goes to family first.. we all know that... it's why I make this available to everyone! On top of that, every year, several Brothers send in their check for their dues and include extra money to help cover those who can't afford it. As it says in our charter and our ceremonies, "CHARITY BEGINS AT HOME!" Amen, Vivat Jesus!


